



Proclamation

By the Mayor of Prattville, Alabama

WHEREAS, Autism is a devastating, lifelong, and often incapacitating developmental disability, resulting in significant impairment of an individual's ability to learn, develop healthy interactive relationships, and understand verbal, nonverbal, and reciprocal communications; and

WHEREAS, Autism is the result of neurological dysfunction, directly effecting the functioning of the brain, and few members of the general public understand the complexity of this disorder; and

WHEREAS, although a cure for Autism is not yet been found, persons with the disorder can be helped to reach their greatest potential through accurate, early diagnosis and the resulting appropriate education and intervention, which are vital to the future growth and development of the individuals; and

WHEREAS, support groups, such as the River Region Autism Support Group, and the Autism Society for Alabama have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all person with Autism; and

WHEREAS, these groups remain committed to the cause of educating families, professionals and the general public so that they may be aware of and better understand the nature of this disability; and

WHEREAS, Autism in its complexity, requires both increased research in order to find a cure and great recognition and understanding in order to ensure that individuals with Autism living in our community, our state and throughout our country are accurately diagnosed, effectively education and appropriately treated throughout the duration of their lives.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Gillespie, Jr., Mayor of the City of Prattville, Alabama, do hereby Proclaim April, 2013 as

Autism Awareness Month
